

Highway to culture

AUSTRALIA'S North West Tourism has been successful in its bid for funding for the development of a tourist Drive Trail linking Exmouth and Broome.

The Drive Trail will connect the iconic destinations of Ningaloo and its whalesharks to Broome and its famous beach.

Project manager Nerreda Hillier said the Warlu Way Drive Trail would link Coral Bay and the Cape Range National Park with the Karijini and Millstream National Parks.

She said North West Tourism would be in Exmouth this week to

meet with key stakeholders to discuss the Drive Trail.

The "Warlu Way" relates to a snake meandering its way across an ancient landscape in Aboriginal culture.

The Warlu Way Drive Trail will follow some 1800km of world-renowned cultural and natural landscapes.

These include Karijini National Park, with its geological features and gorge experiences, the Millstream-Chichester National Park, a billabong oasis, and the Burrup Peninsula, the world's largest, most diverse and oldest collection of petroglyphs.
