Greens get top environmental score while Garrett gets an F

The Greens have come out on top with 93% in a survey conducted by the Australian Conservation Foundation rating the major parties environment policies.

The Greens are the only party to score five out of five on all seven questions relating to policies to tackle climate change.

“For years the Greens have been committed to supporting local renewable energy industries, and taking advantage of the opportunities presented by climate change,” said Scott Ludlam, Greens Senate Candidate.

The ALP scored 49% and Coalition a dismal 21% Family .

Today the Greens will present Labor’s environment spokesperson, former president of the ACF, Peter Garrett with an environmental report card. Like the ACF, The Greens believe the ALP has failed on environmental issues.

“Mr Garrett has refused to defend the environment. He has been a silent accomplice on approvals of the Pluto Project on the Burrup Peninsula, the Gorgon Gas project on Barrow Island and the Tasmanian pulp mill.

“The Greens are a good chance to pick up another Senate seat in Western Australia. If the ALP won’t stand up to protect our environment, we certainly will.”
